	<ul> <li>Trails are a top outdoor recreation priority in the 2016 GPRRC Master Plan.</li> </ul>	
	• County going forward with detailed design and construction from northern existing paved trail on 704A south through the future Wapiti Recreation Area.	
	This will connect to a pedestrian walkway that will run under the new HWY 40 bridge. The goal and mandate are to connect these trails.	
	<ul> <li>Alberta Transportation will hand over the service road that runs from the bridge abutment on the north side of the river, up into the old gravel pit in Wapiti Recreation Area, and this will form a part of the trail.</li> <li>New trails will be non-motorized. Alberta Public Lands have committed to assisting County in education and management of users. Environment and Protected Areas have education officers who will assist with this.</li> <li>Hope to be completed by Spring/Summer 2024, blue and orange sections to be completed Fall of this year.</li> </ul>	
	Hope to be completed by Spring/Summer 2024, blue and orange sections to be completed Fall of this year. Full connectivity to O'Brien Park in summer 2024. Speaks to vision of Clairmont to Nitehawk trail. Grant application with natural infrastructure grant. Goal of grant is to see areas rehabilitated. Councillor Schlief from MD advised that there is a proposed trail by Magoos landing that will allow	
	motorized vehicles and will connect to Swan City Snowmobile Club and Big Mountain.  Councillor Bosch raised concern as to what is considered motorized, for example E-Bikes. Shared concern	
	that it will limit recreation opportunities.
